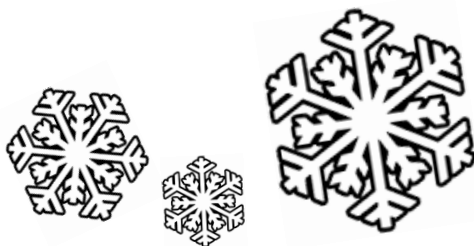


North Haven School
